Introduction

2022 was a very important year for ICCT. It was a year of consolidation, after the transition to independence. But more than *just* consolidating, ICCT proved extremely active, publishing 50 publications on its website, and authoring a number of articles published elsewhere. ICCT organised or contributed to over one hundred events and trainings, in addition to being very present in the international media. In all of these activities, ICCT actually exceeded the expectations. It is not only the number of outputs that increased compared with the previous year, but also our outreach, measured in terms of analytics, and more broadly our impact.

Throughout the year, ICCT has demonstrated its ability to constantly adapt to the evolution of (counter-)terrorism, covering a broad range of topics and regions through its activities. Furthermore, ICCT also sought to anticipate or reflect on some of the deeper evolutions that could affect CT and P/CVE. ICCT is a small but dynamic organisation. In 2022, we worked actively on 24 different projects, funded by a variety of donors (Dutch government, other governments, EU, NATO, etc.). This is more than any other previous years for ICCT. Furthermore, these projects cover a broad range of thematic and geographical expertise, as well as very diverse types of deliverables. All this suggests that our organisation is maturing and ready to grow further in a sustainable manner.

ICCT's staff also grew in 2022, reflecting the additional amount of work but also some strategic choices. Notably, a Senior Fellow Strategic Communications was recruited to rebuild ICCT's reputation in this field, and a Junior Monitoring & Evaluation (M&E) Officer was hired to support ICCT's ambition to become a leader in CT and P/CVE M&E.

About ICCT

The International Centre for Counter-Terrorism (ICCT) is a think-and-do tank based in The Hague, Netherlands. We provide research, policy advice, training and other solutions to support better counter-terrorism policies and practices worldwide. We also contribute to the scientific and public debates in the fields of counter-terrorism and countering violent extremism, notably through our publications and events.

We work with various governments, international organisations and international agencies. Our activities are global, with a focus over the past few years on Europe, the Middle East and Africa.

ICCT is an independent foundation that was established in 2010 by the T.M.C. Asser Institute, Leiden University's Institute of Security and Global Affairs (ISGA), and Clingendael Institute, as a result of an initiative originating in the Dutch parliament (motion Çörüz, April 2008).

ICCT in a Snapshot

1. Total staff and ICCT affiliates in 2022

In 2022, ICCT employed 22 staff members and 14 interns in total, throughout the year. We also maintained a community of 54 ICCT Associate/Distinguished Fellows, 3 Visiting Fellows and 36 Editorial Board members. These are leading scholars and/or practitioners contributing to our thematic approaches to countering terrorism.

2. Website views and visitors

ICCT website registered a significant increase in views and visits during 2022. We saw a 33% increase in website views and a 75% in website visitors compared to 2021. Users mainly found their way to our website through direct searches, followed by social media posts, referrals from other websites, organic searches and ICCT newsletters. The geographical regions of website visitors included North America, Europe, South America, Asia, Africa, Australia.

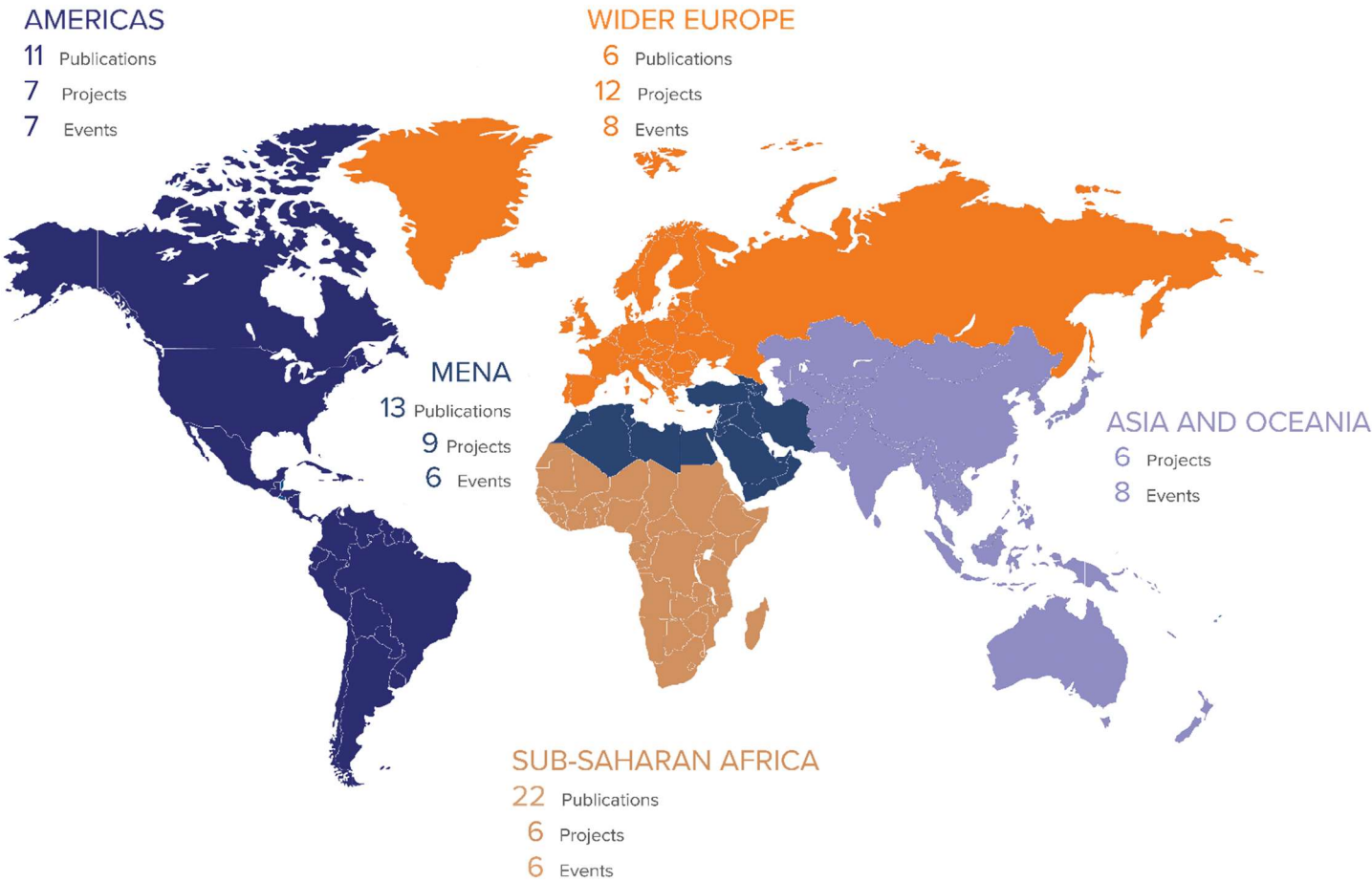

3. ICCT Global Impact in 2022

ICCT has managed to maintain a worldwide impact throughout 2022. In Europe more specifically, we offered trainings and advice to policy-makers and practitioners from EU countries through the Radicalisation Awareness Network (RAN). We implemented several activities outside Europe as well, notably in the Western Balkans, in Iraq and in the Sahel. Furthermore, we have provided webinars covering topics in Southeast Asia, Central America, MENA, Africa and Eastern Europe.

6. ICCT Podcast series

The podcast series “The Global Politics of Counter-Terrorism” delves into how global geopolitics were having an impact on the global counter-terrorism agenda and to what extent Human Rights remained (or not) at the centre of that agenda— through conversations with practitioners, academics and policy-makers.



The four episodes recorded in late 2022 were released in early 2023. The four experts interviewed were:

- Naureen Fink, Executive director for The Soufan Center, focused on the United Nations CT Agenda;
- Marc Hecker, Director of Research and Communications at the French Institute of International Relations (IFRI), focused on the European CT agenda and the Sahel;
- Raffaello Pantucci, Senior Fellow in the International Centre for Political Violence and Terrorism Research (ICPVTR) at the S. Rajaratnam School of International Studies (RSIS) in Singapore, discussed China and Afghanistan;
- Daniel Byman, professor at Georgetown University, discussed the shift in the US CT agenda.

7. ICCT Events

ICCT organised 12 public events, as part of its public-oriented mission, and 2 Summer programmes (jointly co-organised with Asser Institute and the Institute of Security and Global Affairs at Leiden University) in the course of 2022. In addition, ICCT experts co-organised or contributed to over 120 events and trainings in the context of consortium projects, or hosted by partner organisations.

5.2 Project Summaries'

1. **Prosecution, Rehabilitation and Reintegration of Female Violent Extremist Offenders in Europe:** The general objectives of this project, funded by the Dutch National Coordinator for Security and Counterterrorism, are two-fold. First, it is to inform practitioners and policy makers involved in prosecution, prison management, rehabilitation, and reintegration of returning female returnees and VEOs of existing approaches and identified needs or gaps in Belgium, France, Germany, and the Netherlands. Second, this project will formulate recommendations for a more evidence-based and rule-of-law compliant approach. ICCT will conduct at least six structured interviews per country, organised a closed-door workshop for practitioners, write a final report on research findings, then organise a live briefing to disseminate these findings.
2. **PREPARE:** In this EU-funded project, ICCT and its PREPARE partners, including research organisations and law enforcement entities, take a human-rights, rule-of-law, and gender-informed approach to make contemporary knowledge, training, and tools accessible to practitioners working with the children of far right and Islamist parents. The project, Promoting collaborative policies of inclusion relating to children of far right and Islamist parents in Western Europe (PREPARE), was guided by a human-rights, rule-of-law and gender informed approach, and focused on ix case studies: Sweden, The Netherlands, France, Germany, Spain and Kosovo. The project identified the vulnerabilities and stigmas children may develop in family environments where they are opposed to extremism through interviews with experts, practitioners and family members. The PREPARE project team brought together a range of experts and front-line practitioners in a series of workshops to draw out their insights on the vulnerabilities and risk factors of children from violent extremist-affiliated families. Research findings, along with these insights, were used to inform the design of a new, unique Child Vulnerability and Intervention Tool, as well as tailor a Train-The-Trainer Training Programme, and a "Practitioners' Guide to Working with Children in VE-Affiliated Families: Protecting the Rights of the Child."
3. **Prosecution, Rehabilitation and Reintegration (PRR) Practices in Iraq:** This project aimed to provide technical expertise on screening, risk assessment, rehabilitation, and reintegration of adults and children being repatriated by Iraq from Northeast Syria. ICCT's work on PRR in Iraq contributes to the broader efforts of the United Nations Global Framework on the return of third-country nationals from Iraq/Syria. During 2022, ICCT has organized, in partnership with the International Organization for Migration (IOM) and the Office of the National Security Advisor (ONSA) of Iraq, four roundtables on Prosecution, Rehabilitation, and Reintegration (PRR) for relevant government institutions in Iraq, as well as international organisations. Taking place in Erbil and Baghdad between February and April 2022, the roundtables provided a platform for ICCT experts to share their substantive expertise and guidance on aspects of screening, risk assessment, rehabilitation, and reintegration, and allowed for a facilitated dialogue with Iraqi stakeholders on how identified good practices could be applied in the specific context of the 30,000 Iraqi nationals returning from al-Hol Camp in North-East Syria. The project is expected to continue during 2023. ICCT experts will publish research on good practices and lessons

learned in case management of returnees, as well as how to treat offences related to membership of terrorist organisations. ICCT experts will further develop boutique training materials that will improve the capabilities of those involved in the development and design of the case management system.

4. **Reintegrating Returnee Spouses and Children:** ICCT has, since 2021, been contributing to US Department of Homeland Security-funded project "Best Practices for Reintegration Programs for Returning Spouses and Children". The project goals are to: (1) comprehensively evaluate the existing knowledge and practice of the reintegration of spouses and children associated with FTFs; and (2) promote evidence-based models for the reintegration of returning spouses and children through the development and dissemination of effective protocols, tools, and training curricula for practitioners. The project is delivering two major annual reports, written jointly by project convenors at the National Counterterrorism Innovation, Technology, and Education Center (NCITE) at the University of Nebraska and The Programme on Extremism (PoE) at George Washington University. ICCT contributed critical expertise in the legal and human rights principles relevant to the practice of reintegration.
5. **GNET:** The Global Network on Extremism and Technology (GNET) is an academic research initiative backed by the Global Internet Forum to Counter Terrorism (GIFCT), an independent but industry-funded initiative for better understanding, and counteracting, terrorist use of technology. ICCT is a core partner in this, and its broad network of experts contribute numerous publications, coordination support, and expertise at annual conferences.
6. **Utrecht Ideology Plan:** ICCT conducted research to help future-proof the Municipality of Utrecht's responses to current and possible new social developments. ICCT has conducted research into the current and emerging trends in radicalisation to different forms of extremism relevant for the municipality of Utrecht, the Netherlands. In the final report, ICCT identified six relevant trends. Building on this, ICCT developed a set of tailor-made localised interventions for the municipality of Utrecht to help future-proof the city's responses to current and possible new social developments for the next 5 years, then presented these to policymakers.
7. **CT MORSE:** ICCT participates in the European Union project CT Monitoring, Reporting and Support Mechanisms (MORSE), funded in third countries under the Instrument contributing to Stability and Peace (IcSP). Since its establishment in January 2015, CT MORSE has focused on strengthening the global delivery of the various CT and P/CVE projects financed by the EU through improving coordination and coherence, as well as reinforcing EU engagement within the Global Counter Terrorism Forum (GCTF) framework. In 2022, ICCT conducted consultation and fieldwork that were elaborated into a final report that provided a comprehensive overview of needs and options for EU support to repatriation of Iraqis in the al-Hol camp to Iraq. This paper was presented to key stakeholders in March 2023.
8. **RAN:** ICCT is a core partner in the European Commission's Radicalisation Awareness Network Policy Support (RAN PS) project. Launched in January 2021, RAN PS aims to bridge the gap between policymaking and research. RAN PS supports EU Member States and

priority third countries in the prevention and countering of radicalisation, strategic communications, and evidence-based policymaking, through knowledge-sharing and capacity-building. ICCT is a functional unit coordinator overseeing the organisation of the network's capacity-building and knowledge-sharing events. ICCT is also a lead implementing partner, providing subject matter expertise on EU priority topics including risk assessment in prison, strategic communications, as well as the threat posed by conspiracy theories, disinformation and the mainstreaming of radical discourses. ICCT's policy support activities include delivery of workshops, training programmes, study visits, and research papers. In conducting these activities, ICCT routinely maps the state of threats, reviews existing tools to combat them, and distils best practices or recommendations on how these can be improved.

9. **Transatlantic Fellowship Programme:** ICCT's Transatlantic Fellowship Program seeks to build and strengthen the mutual understanding between the United States and the Netherlands through carefully designed short-term visiting fellowships. These short-term visits aim to offer insights and exchange experiences between U.S. and Dutch experts and policymakers, and inform the debate on timely topics in efforts to enhance international security. By doing so, the ICCT Transatlantic Fellowship Program seeks to defend and strengthen shared values between the Netherlands and the United States with regard to human rights and the mutual interest to protect and promote freedom and democracy. ICCT's Transatlantic Fellowship Program is funded by the Municipality of The Hague.
10. **Summer Programmes:** ICCT, along with the T.M.C. Asser Instituut and the Leiden University Centre for Professional Learning, has been organising advanced summer programmes in The Hague on countering terrorism in the post-9/11 world and on preventing, detecting and responding to the violent extremist threat. These two programmes are designed to be complementary. The objective of this unique Summer Programme is to provide participants with a deepened understanding of the phenomena of violent extremism, radicalisation and terrorism, the contemporary methods to counter it and the applicable international legal framework.
11. **Non-Violent Right-Wing Extremist Tactics:** Previously primarily known for its overt violent actions, the right-wing extremist movement has been increasingly opting for non-violent and more stealthy tactics in recent years. The Dutch Ministry of Social Affairs and Employment sought to understand how to relate to these tactical shifts, in service of its mission to prevent violent extremism. ICCT conducted a literature review into the topic of non-violent right-wing extremist tactics. ICCT presented initial findings to municipal policymakers during an expert roundtable on 11 July. Drawing on this, ICCT submitted a final report to the Ministry of Social Affairs and Labour in October 2022.
12. **Assessing 20 Years of Counter-Terrorism:** The RESOLVE Network-funded project assessed the United Nations Security Council's counterterrorism efforts since the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001, as well as lessons learned in addressing the evolving terrorist threat. Drawing on wide ranging research, analysis and consultations, the project offered policy-relevant recommendations for ensuring that the UNSC's approach to addressing terrorist threats is both effective and sustainable. To disseminate these, ICCT, in coordination with the Soufan Center, organised a two-day conference in the Hague on 'Assessing 20 Years of Counterterrorism & Recalibrating the Way Forward'.

- 13. USAID Customary Resilience:** This USAID-funded research project seeks to further the understanding of the role of traditional authorities (TAs) in strengthening and/or weakening community resilience to violent extremism in the Sahel. ICCT partnered with the Conflict Research Unit (CRU), and with local research partners in Niger, Mali and Burkina Faso to conduct this. Based on analysis of extensive quantitative and qualitative data, the project team produced reports exploring the role of these authorities in building resilience to violent extremism across six studied regions. Alongside this, ICCT experts developed detailed policy recommendations and entry points for international and national actors seeking to support traditional and religious leaders in their resilience role.
- 14. Workshops on Criminal Justice Responses to the Linkages between Terrorism and International Crimes:** To support practitioners and policymakers in boosting their efforts to strengthen criminal justice responses to ensure suspected terrorists are held accountable for the full range of crimes they have committed, the ICCT collaborated with The International Institute for Justice and the Rule of Law (IIJ) to deliver four Workshops on the implementation of GCTF guidance on linkages between terrorism and 'core international crimes'. These drew together and provided guidance to stakeholders across Africa, MENA, and South and South-East Asia. These efforts were funded by the Swiss Federal Department of Foreign Affairs.
- 15. Threat Assessments:** The Dutch National Coordinator for Security and Counter-Terrorism (NCTV) commissioned ICCT to conduct a number of threat assessments from 2018 - 2021. In February 2022, with funding from the NCTV and the Dutch Ministry of Foreign Affairs, ICCT conducted a follow-up Terrorism Threat Assessment. This covered the two year period between September 2019 - August 2021, and again covered the Madrid Group Member Countries. As such, this determined whether the terrorist threat had changed in: Australia, Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Canada, Croatia, Cyprus, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Italy, Japan, Luxembourg, Malta, the Netherlands, New Zealand, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, the UK and the US.
- 16. Foreign Terrorist Fighters Knowledge Hub:** The Foreign Terrorist Fighters (FTF) Knowledge Hub was conceived with the aim of providing better insight and understanding of the FTF phenomenon, and inspire the development of rule of law-compliant FTF policies. This builds on the previous FTF Knowledge Hub hosted by and developed under the auspices of the GCTF, but nevertheless remains an independent project. Researchers from ICCT, together with those at the T.M.C Asser Institute, gathered open-source data from a total of thirty GCTF countries. They conducted quantitative and qualitative analysis regarding criminal procedures, administrative measures, surveillance measures, and the prevention policies that are in place in these countries. The FTF Knowledge Hub offers, among other things: country-specific data regarding FTFs; information on countries' responses to FTFs (including preventative, administrative, criminal and surveillance measures), international standards for FTFs, and a library of academic research on FTF-related trends. It is freely accessible and aimed at policymakers, practitioners, academics, journalists and students.
- 17. Database on Interlinkages between Terrorism and International Crimes:** The Swedish Department of Justice is funding the expansion of ICCT's existing database collection of domestic cases in which terrorists have been tried for core international crimes. This will

expand to cover all countries where trials for terrorism and war crimes have taken place. The information gathered will be analysed with a view to identifying challenges, areas for development, and good practice in prosecuting individuals both for terrorism and for any other crimes they may have committed, including crimes against girls and women.

- 18. Radicalisation Awareness Network Policy Support: West Balkans:** Within the broader framework of the European Union policy on preventing and countering radicalisation and violent extremism (P-CVE), and the Joint Action Plan on Counterterrorism for the Western Balkans, the global objective of the RAN PS Balkans is to improve evidence-based policy formulation to radicalisation in the Western Balkans. In August 2022, the Commission upgraded its support to policymakers by issuing a specific contract to extend the activities of the RAN PS to the Western Balkans partners. Support will be delivered from 2022 - 2025 in Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Croatia, Kosovo (this designation made without prejudice to positions on status), Montenegro, North Macedonia, and Serbia. More specifically, the RAN PS Balkans aims to give support to Western Balkan policy makers in developing and implementing national and local P-CVE policies, by providing evidence-based data; enhancing the uptake of EU best practices and approaches; and strengthening strategic and operational cooperation within the region and with the EU on terrorism and P-CVE. This will focus on the thematic areas of: Ideologies and Polarisation; Prison, Radicalisation, Rehabilitation and Reintegration; The Online Dimension and Strategic Communications; The Local Dimension, Communities and Resilience Building; and Victims and Survivors of Terrorism. Through the implementation of its activities the RAN PS Balkans will also contribute to reduce the gap between research and policy makers. Eighteen capacity-building events, eleven specialised papers, and four research-related meetings are being organised.
- 19. NATO Guidebook on Counter-Terrorism Cooperation:** NATO aims to enhance engagement with partner countries and other international actors, given that its experience in multilateralism and international cooperation can be of value to partner countries in addressing terrorism. ICCT was commissioned by NATO, and has been working closely with it to develop a non-binding collection of good practices and recommendations on inter-agency and international cooperation in countering terrorism. In 2022, ICCT completed the first draft of the handbook, which is currently under review by NATO. This was based on NATO's own experience, and that of its Allies, on how to strengthen counter-terrorism effectively through inter-agency coordination and international cooperation. When counter-terrorism policies are firmly grounded in the rule of law and respect human rights, they can effectively contribute to countering terrorism and mitigate some of the drivers of radicalisation to violent extremism.
- 20. Supporting Iraq Civil Society in Effective PCVE:** In this project, funded by German Cooperation, ICCT provided training and co-creation support to Iraqi civil society organisations seeking German funding for projects in the field of preventing violent extremism (PVE). ICCT's role was to help these organisations gain the knowledge and skills necessary to develop impactful project proposals. The focus of ICCT's work was to ground proposals in contemporary PVE approaches, ensure strong monitoring and evaluation (M&E) practices, and help contextualise projects to the needs and challenges of different governorates across Iraq. To this end, ICCT delivered English-language and Arabic-language training to over 50 representatives from 15 applicant organisations in Iraq. Additionally,

ICCT international PVE experts and national conflict sensitivity experts provided tailored co-creation support to each organisation over a period of several months, supporting proposal development. ICCT will continue supporting Iraqi civil society organisations in effective PCVE in 2023 and 2024.

21. Strategic Communications and Disinformation: Violent extremists and terrorist organisations have used disinformation to spin the Covid-19 pandemic and other global events in their own favour. While this is problematic, it also presents an opportunity: equipping at-risk populations with the tools to identify and challenge disinformation can also bolster their resilience against terrorist and extremist narratives that drive recruitment and radicalisation. Since 2021, ICCT has been implementing the European Commission’s FPI project on “Strategic Communications and Disinformation”. First, this will contribute to a thorough understanding of the interlinked challenges of disinformation and terrorism/extremism within and outside of the EU. Second, this will support the development of capacities to address this challenge. ICCT has already conducted extensive research into strategic communications and disinformation in the Western Balkans and Southern Caucasus’, around the Lake Chad Basin, in Iraq. Practices and areas for improvement will be compiled into a Global Guidance Document, which will promote the resilience of at-risk populations against terrorists spreading disinformation. The project’s M&E component will measure the impact and implementation of this project, so as to develop knowledge on effective strategic communications interventions and evidence-based policymaking.

22. Rehabilitation & Reintegration Support to the Kosovo Probation Service: The Kosovar Centre for Security Studies (KCSS) and the International Centre for Counter-Terrorism (ICCT) are conducting this project in collaboration. The project is funded by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Kingdom of Netherlands and the United Kingdom Embassy in Pristina. ICCT and KCSS, through close consultations with the Kosovo Probation Service (KPS), will improve institutional skills and tools to better design, monitor, and evaluate rehabilitation and reintegration (R&R) programmes targeting returnees from Syria and Iraq and their families. ICCT experts have designed and delivered a two-day training on the overall design of gender-sensitive rehabilitation and reintegration (R&R) programmes in Kosovo (and conducted an Impact Assessment of this training). The project team will participate in inter-institutional workshops that will enable better communication and information-sharing. Drawing on consultations with relevant stakeholders, ICCT and KCSS will also design and deliver a training to improve KPS risk assessment tools and capacities. Moreover, the partners will provide a tailored training for P/CVE and R&R focal points within the KPS, and support the development of a cross-institutional database that will coordinate, monitor, and track R&R programs.
